
The firm of Grant & Ward began business at the corner of Wall street and Broadway. From the beginning it ranked high as a financial institution. It began business with a capital of \$400,000, of which General Grant supplied \$100,000. Grant was merely a silent partner. He knew nothing of business; everything was left to Ward, the financial wizard who swept Wall street off its feet by the enormous dividends paid to "investors." He was soon the most talked of man in New York. / Ward never played to the gallery. It was the big man he "got."
