

EARLY REPORT ON
NEW OFFENSIVE

Attack Farther North Suffers
Check on First Day

SOME PROGRESS IN CENTRE

Drive Launched on Noyon Sector
—French Take Care of Wings
Without Calling on Reserves—
British Bombarred Heavily but
no Infantry Attack

London, June 10.—The French troops appear to be putting up a splendid resistance to the Germans on the Noyon sector, especially on the two flanks of the attacking front where the heaviest fighting continues. The Germans have made some progress in the centre, where they claim the capture of the heights of Gury, while the French admit the loss of the villages of Rezon-sur-Matz and Mareuil.

It was generally expected that the new German attack, launched on Sunday, would come between Noyon and Montdidier, thus seemingly resuming the direct thrust for Paris. Simultaneously with the bombardment on the Noyon sector the British front was subjected to a heavy fire, including gas shells, which seemed to herald another attack. According to the latest accounts, no infantry attempt developed against the British lines.

There is little news yet from the German side as the German official statement, issued on Sunday afternoon, referred only to the operations of Saturday.

Check on First Day.

Paris, June 10.—"It was a perfectly satisfactory day," said Premier Clemenceau last night. In these words the French leader accurately summed up the prevailing impression.

Latest advices from the battle front show that on the whole the enemy clearly suffered a check on the day's operations. The enemy gained a slight advantage in the centre on a front of three and three-quarters miles, about a fourth of the entire line of attack. On the wings he was stopped with such losses that five divisions have been put out of commission, or about one-third of the divisions identified up to the present as having taken part in the attack. This was done without the French reserves being called on.

The Germans had to bring up their troops at the last moment in order to avoid giving alarm to the Allies. As the columns arrived they were compelled to deploy from the column of march into the line of attack. This operation, which takes some hours, exposes the men to an unpleasant artillery fire unless the element of surprise is preserved.

The German attacking troops continued to envelop the heights of Boesens and Biquenay, dominating the Matz Valley, offering a splendid target to the French gunners. The enemy had to throw in division after division before he was able to drive his way forward to Rezon-sur-Matz and Mareuil along the Roye road which was swept by French fire.

Rezon-sur-Matz is a central position from which the enemy can direct attacks southward to Estrees St. Denis or southeast to Compiègne. He is being strongly counter-attacked, however, and will be able to develop his advantage only at heavy cost, if at all.

Henry Bidon, military critic, says: "Let us be wary at the beginning of an important offensive of forming judgments, but without prejudging the future it is difficult not to be satisfied with the first day."

War Summary

The armies of Crown Prince Rupprecht of Bavaria again are hitting the allied line in a new offensive with Paris apparently their objective. Between Mont Didier and Roye, over a front of about twenty miles, preceded, as usual, by a heavy bombardment with shells of all calibres and with noxious gases, the enemy's initial manoeuvre evidently has in view the bending back of the Allied front toward the town of St. Iux, on the northern wing and toward the railroad junction of Compiègne on the southern flank, getting astride the Oise river and driving southwest toward the French capital.

The French troops are resisting the impact with their wonted valour, but the Germans on their right and in the centre, have been able to penetrate the line for distances ranging from two thirds of a mile south of Mont Didier to relatively two and a half miles at Rezon-sur-Matz, in the centre. Then to Noyon, however, the allied line is holding strongly. If success should rest with the enemy on the new battle front it possibly might badly affect the stability of the line of the defenders from the Oise to the Marne and compel a falling back toward Flanders, the region of the Marne north-west of Chateau Thierry in order to straighten out the front.

The allied command has not as yet announced their views on this as asserted, were they held up by masked men with revolvers. The robbers escaped with the booty, but dropped a bag containing \$5,000 in the course of a hot pursuit. The acting officer in charge of the Victorian Railway Union has been arrested in connection with the robbery.

BATTALION OF WOMEN FOR WORK OVERSEAS

London, Ont., June 10.—A campaign has been started here to raise a women's battalion for overseas services, similar to the one recently organized in Winnipeg. Already there have been scores of applicants, and it is expected that 1,000 will be enlisted without any trouble. The object is to carry on work in France similar to the British Women's Auxiliary Service.
