

That having carefully deliberated on the subject of Ministers' Salaries, in consequence of the increased expenditure in all articles of produce, the Conference unanimously adopt the following scale :—

(7.) That a married Minister in full Connexion, have £25 per quarter.

(8.) That the salary of all married Ministers, on *probation*, be £20 per quarter.

(9.) That the salary of single Ministers in full Connexion, be £12 per quarter, exclusive of Board and Horse keep.

(10.) That the salary of single Ministers on *probation*, be £10 per quarter, with Board and Horse keep.

(11.) That if a *Circuit* chose to make any arrangement with its Minister, to grant him more allowance than is stated in the rule, it shall be at liberty to do so.

(12.) That the first Quarterly Meeting on each Station, after Conference, shall make the needful regulations to raise the amounts for the Minister's Salary, and where they think expedient, they shall form a Committee, to solicit from the regular hearers quarterly contributions on behalf of the cause of God.

(13.) That in all Stations where the Minister's Horse is not provided for, by the Station, the horse allowance for Cities be £3 5s. per quarter; and for Towns and Country Stations, £2 10s. per quarter.

(14.) That the following *grants* of Missionary Monies be appropriated to the various Mission Stations for the ensuing year :—*Kingston*, £75 ; *Portland*, £75 ; *Osprey and Vincent*, £30 ; *Galt and Blenheim*, 100 ; *Pearl and Wellesley*, 70 ; *Bransford and Paris*, £90 ; *Bosanquet*, £40 ; *North Road*, £7 10s. ; *Napinee*, £70 ; *Guelph*, £75 ; *Orangeville*, £50 ; *London*, £190 ; *Brant*, £53 ; *Walsingham*, £10.

(15.) The General Committee Delegates to the District Meetings, if practicable, be appointed Delegates to the ensuing Conference.
