INSTRUCTIONS TO REGISTER KEEPERS

To parade in front of Secretary's tent at half past eight o'clock every morning for orders.

To take post before the commencement of the firing at each range, at the rallying post first chosen, and to draw for targets.

To march the squad directly to firing point of target drawn. To enter rank, name, corps, and number of ticket correctly from the ticket.

Not to let any one shoot without he gives up his ticket.

To maintain silence at firing point.

To call "cease firing" in a loud tone whenever the danger flag is shown at any of the butts.

To call out distinctly before commencement of firing the distance and number of target.

To call competitors in regular order to fire.

To call out result of each shot before recording it.

To mark out any error, and enter correct figure on the same line in column of remarks, and at foot of register to note the number of such corrections.

Not to total the scores of retired competitors.

To read aloud the totals at the conclusion of the firing of each rank at each range.

To take every precaution that no time is unnecessarily lost between the shots.

To see that the "Regulations for firing" are adhered to.

To sign the register.

Not to enter into any dispute but at once to refer any doubtful point to the Range Officer.

Not to allow any but officers in authority to see the register. To deliver the register to the Secretary at the close of each competition or day.
