Three to four hours after the injection there came a pain in the limbs, fatigue, inclination to cough, difficulty of breathering, which speedily increased in the fifth hour, and were unusually violent. A chill followed, which lasted almost an hour. At the same time there was nausea, vomiting and a rise of body temperature to 39.6° C. After 12 hours all these symptoms abated, the temperature fell, and on the next day it was normal. A feeling of fatigue and pain in the limbs continued for a few days and for exactly the same period of time the site of injection remained slightly painful and red.

In several cases a slight ieteric discoloration was observed, and occasionally an eruption like measles on the chest and neck. The attack usually begins four to five hours
