ONE THOUSAND
CANADIANS IN
CASUALTIES

Many From New Brunswick
and Prince Edward Island
Wounded--Few Killed.

Ottawa, Aug. 24.--Results of the
 heavy fighting on the Canadian front
 are reflected in the casualty lists,
 totalling more than 1,000 for the
 week end. The noon list today num-
 bers 227, whom nineteen are killed
