Preparations were made at Mr. Elkus' office to send out 40.000 of the questionaires. An increase in assessment on pro-perty, on which rents had been raised unfairly, was suggested as a method to carb such profiteering by Henry Block, a member of the Mayor's committee. Mr. Block declared that, if the land-lords insisted upon mulcting the pub-lic, the city was entitled to get more taxes from them. Dr. A.
