

The Oldest Post Office In America

One in St. Augustine, Fla., Was Built Over 300 Years Ago for Spanish Governor.

Ago for Spanish Governor.

St. Augustine, Fla., Jan. 23.—St. Augustine is believed to possess the oldest post office building in the country. Postmaster Chas. F. Hopkins, after a research extending over a period of two years, has received copies of official records in the "Archivee of the fighter" at Seville, Spain, showing that the structure he now occupies was erected sometime between 15cS and 1603 by one Gonzalo Mender. The Sking of Spain purchased the building in 1604 as a residence for the Spanish governors of Florida, and it served as such until Florida was transferred to the United States in 1821.

In the archives at Seville were found efficial "Letters and Dispatches of the Governor of Florida seen in Council from the years 1854 to 1610," and one referring to the purchese of a ohme for the Governor in St. Augustine in dicated that the housing situation in America more than 300 years ago was little better than it has been the last few years. It read: "To His Majesty from the Governor Pedro De Ydarra on the Sth day of January, 1604:

"In this city they have never had a house for the Governor and when a arrived they lodged me in a house which was built over the seas, and it was so cold and damp that two Governor were Galiteres de Miranda and Domingo Martines de Avendane. Even the swaren himself has never been well in it, nor taxe I been so since my arrival.
