Refuse To Pay Tax Until Roadway Has Been Repaired

Property Owners of Chester Street Up in Arms-Declare They Will Enter Lawsuit If Necessary, and Demand That Work Done Be Condemned.

ST. THOMAS, Feb. 24.—The property owners of Chester street, through G. R. McKenzie, notified the board of works that they will not pay the frontage tax charged to their holdings until the roadway is placed in proper repair. The residents declare that they will first stand for a lawsuit rather than contribute a cent of taxes for the work on the street.

Mr. McKenzie presented a petition by practically every taxpayer on the highway, protesting against the alleged improvements, and demanded that what has been done there now be condemned and the residents will then sign a fresh petition for the construction of a proper and permanent roadway.
