

PUBLIC HEALTH!

NOTICE is hereby given to all owners or occupants of premises in the **TOWN OF BOWMANVILLE**, on which there is any foul or offensive ditch, gutter, drain, privy, cesspool, stable, hog-pen, ash-pit, cellar; or upon which there is an accumulation of dung, manure, offal, filth, refuse, stagnant water, or other matter or thing dangerous to public health, that they are hereby required to cleanse or remove same **FORTHWITH**.

That all persons aforesaid who, upon an inspection made under direction of the Board of Health, shall be found to have neglected to cleanse their premises or to have removed all matters injurious to the public health, will be prosecuted according to law.

It is hoped all citizens will heartily co-operate with the Board in putting the Town in as satisfactory a sanitary condition as possible. Sanitation to be effective must be general. The Board strongly recommends the free use of disinfectants, information with respect to which will be freely given by **DR. COLVILLE**, Medical Health officer.

Notice left with the undersigned of any matter requiring the intervention of the Board of Health, will receive prompt attention.
