V. And be it further enacted, That an Act, made in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Second, for the more effectual securing the Duties now payable on Foreign-made Sail Cloth imported into this Kingdom, and for charging all Foreign-made Sails with a Duty, and for explaining a Doubt concerning Ships being obliged at their first setting out to Sea to be furnished with One complete Set of Sails, made of *British* Sail Cloth, which was to continue in force from the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand seven hundred and forty-six for the Term of Sixteen Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and which, by several subsequent Acts made in the Twenty-sixth and Thirty-second Years of the Reign of His said late Majesty, and of the Sixth, Fourteenth, Twenty-second, Twenty-ninth, and Thirty-sixth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, was further continued until the Twenty-ninth Day of *September* One thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, shall be, and the same is hereby further continued until the Twenty-ninth Day of *September* One thousand eight hundred and four, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.

VI. And be it further enacted, That so much of an Act, made in the Tenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as relates to regulating the Fees of the Officers of the Customs, and of the Naval Officers in the *British* Colonies in *America*, which was to be in force from the First Day of *August* One thousand seven hundred and seventy, for the Term of Two Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and which, by Four Acts made in the Twelfth, Fourteenth, Nineteenth, and Twenty-third Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, was further continued until the First Day of *August* One thousand seven hundred and eighty-six, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and also so much of an Act, made in the Sixteenth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, as relates to the Fees of the Officers of the Customs in the Island of *Newfoundland*, which was to continue in force so long as the said Act of the Tenth Year of His present Majesty, and which were revived and continued, by an Act of the Thirty-fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for the Term of Five Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, shall be, and the same is hereby further continued until the Ninth Day of *May* One thousand eight hundred and four, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.

And be it further enacted, That so much of an Act, made in the Fifteenth and Sixteenth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George* the Second, intituled, *An Act to empower the Importers or Proprietors of Rum or Spirits of the British Sugar Plantations, to land the same before Payment of the Duties of Excise charged thereon, and to lodge the same in Warehouses at their own Expence; and for the Relief of Ralph Barrow, in respect to the Duty on some Rock Salt lost by the overflowing of the Rivers Weaver and Dane*, as relates to the landing of Rum or Spirits of the
