Times Staff Writer Mississauga is not responsible for the potentially explosive leakage of methane gas from a sanitary landfill site on Springbank Road, says City Solicitor Basil Clark. At a Supreme Court hearing this week, Clark

argued that the city cannot comply to two Ontario Ministry of Environment control orders requiring proper venting of the site to prevent flow of gases to adjacent residential areas. The control orders,

issued after a report was done in May, 1976, showing the possibility of an ex-plosion at the site, "are both clearly illegal in my view," says Clark.

In his argument before Justice Mabel Van Camp, Clark said Mississauga can't comply to the orders because it does not own problem exists. Garbage known as the Newman pit in 1971 and 1972 by the firm of Berrill and Trustrum Ltd. which was contractor for sanitary landfill for the former town of Mississauga.

The lawyer argued that the province can order the person responsible for the land to provide the venting system necessary, but can't order the city because it does not fall into the definition of someone who has care control or management of the source of the contaminant.

## Ex-student may appeal after losing court award
