"Naked Songs" Al Kooper (Columbia KC31723) Al Kooper is a unique figure in the world of rock music. He has changed hats, many times, been in many bands, has not always been consistent, but has survived the sledge hammer that beheads many rock stars.

Naked Songs is Al Kooper in the positive. He is at the peak of his energies on this album. His songs are tight, and his instrumentation is as always, superb. His singing, to many his biggest fault has improved immeasurably.

Kooper has a way of taking other people's tunes and embracing them into his own. Such is the case with John Prine's brilliant, Sam Stone. It is pure Kooper. His guitar work most notably on As The Years Go Passing By is exquisite. The lead line is bluesy, in the style of Michael Bloomfield and Robbie Robertson, two guitarists who have worked with Kooper and obviously he has taken his lessons well.

Kooper's affinity to R&B is

here in the form of the lush Jolie. I can picture Stevie Wonder doing this one. The album is by no means Kooper's best, I still think the first Blood Sweat & Tears album of which he was the founder, is his strongest effort to date, yet when I get a new Al Kooper album I can pretty well be sure that it will be well worn by the time his next one comes out.

Shoot Out At The Fantasy Factory — Traffic (Capitol-Island SW9323) The only reason I'm giving this album any space, is because at one time Traffic was an important band. Now they're just guys putting in time. This album is dull.

The title is quite funny actually. It's like this Fantasy Factory they talk about is the dream place where "hits", or let me rephrase that "good music", is made. This album is none of that.

The last tune aptly titled, Sometimes I feel so Uninspired, is a very accurate summation of a lot of long winded musical jams that go

nowhere and seem to last forever. From a band that once turned out gems like 40 Thousand Headmen and Feelin' Alright, Traffic has gone too far out of sight to get back into the mainstream.

Sandy — Sandy Denny (A&M SP 4371) Sandy Denny, late of Fairport Convention and now as a solo has come up with what might be the folk album of the year. Her haunting voice, penetrating lyrics and superb execution combines to give this album a forcefulness usually lacking English folk music.

Ms. Denny has added the contemporary sound of, or better still the influence of rock music. It has given her a drive that is unique to her style of music. The result is an album that while soothing is never dull. And while forceful is not overbearing. This one is a rare one.

This Is My Story — Sonny Boy Williamson (Chess 9033-50027) Sonny Boy Williamson is one of the few blues artists I can listen to for any length of time. Not being a blues fanatic, I don't listen to much blues, but Sonny Boy is a different story.

This double album is a good representation of his music, it's mostly happy blues — the type of stuff he does, and it's a good introduction to one of the blues masters.
