I am writing to you by the request of those who did not sign the petition of J. B. Kewakeshig cancelling your contract with the Canadian Pottawatamies and employing lawyers in the U.S. through a lawyer in Port Elgin ~~xxxxxxChapman~~ Ontario by the name of Chapman. Mr. J. B. Kewakeshig wrote to his deputy here at Cape Croker demanding some money from those who did not (sic) with him, claiming that the lawyers in U.S. has already introduce the claims into the U. S. Government and ready to be discussed by the Congress And we want to know from you if you know anything about it. And do you release yourself from the contract we have sign with you. If not those who did not sign with J. B. Kewakeshig will not contribute with Mr. J. B. Kewakeshig. Please let us have your advice immediately.
