Camp Borden	13-8-45 (cont.)		A thorough search for personnel who are interested in competing in the Sports Day activities to be held on this unit on August 29th. Even at this early date, there are numerous entries in for the various athletics.	
	14-8-45		0800 hours the ceiling was unlimited, and the visibility was from three to five miles. Flying was washed in at 0830 hours and was washed out at 1405 hours. There was no twilight or night flying. The total flying for the day was 19:30 hours. At 1930 hours No. 1 S.F.T.S. Camp Borden recieved the official announcement of the cessation of hostilities with Japan. The Commanding Officer, Group Captain Harvey <u>AFC</u> made the announcement that all ranks were confined to camp, the official holiday would commence the next morning at 1100 hours.	
	15-8-45		There was a dance held in the W.D. Lounge at 2100 hours, which was well attended, and it was announced that the Commanding Officer would call a V/J day parade at 1100 hours August 15th. There was no flying all day to-day. Group Captain Harvey <u>AFC</u> called a parade at 1100 hours this morning, all ranks were present, and the Commanding Officer announced the end of the war with our enemies in the East, and then called on F/L MacPherson, the Protestant padre and F/L Gavard, the Roman Catholic padre to lead the parade in prayer. The Commanding Officer then told his parade that a holiday of two days was being granted all personnel of No. 1 S.F.T.S. Camp Borden, and that all personnel on course would stop flying until further notice. Only a skeleton staff of No. 3 Duty Watch was kept on the unit for the next two days, they were to receive their holiday at a later date. These personnel remaining on the unit were entertained by a free movie in the Station Theatre.
