

ART. 10. Every person admitted as a Member of the Society, shall pay on his admission, the sum of Two Guineas, to the Treasurer, to be deposited at the time such person is proposed, and two shillings and six pence Monthly, exclusive of what may from time to time, be agreed upon for the expenses of the house in which the Society meets.

ART. 11. There shall always remain in the hands of the Treasurer the Sum of One hundred and Seventy-five Pounds at least, for the payment of the contingent demands on the Society, and the residue of the Money shall be lent out at interest agreeably to Law.

ART. 12. No smaller sum than Fifty Pounds shall be lent on interest, and no greater sum than Two hundred Pounds shall be lent to one Individual; applicants who are Members shall have the preference.

ART. 13. All Monies due to the Society upon securities shall be prosecuted for at the latest, at the second Term of His Majesty's Court of King's Bench, after such monies shall have become due, unless the Society shall have agreed that their bonds
