

SANCT. LUC. — C. 19

29. Et factum est, quum appropinquasset ad Bethphage et Bethaniam, ad montem, qui vocatur Oliveti, misit duos discipulos suos,

30. Dicens: Ite in castellum, quod contraest; in quod introeuntes invenietis pullum asinae alligatum, cui nemo unquam hominum sedit; solvite illum et adducite.

31. Etsi quis vos interrogaverit: Quare solvitis? sic dicetis ei: Quia Dominus operam ejus desiderat.

32. Abierunt autem qui missi erant, et invenerunt, sicut dixit illis, stantem pullum.

33. Solventibus autem illis pullum, dixerunt domini ejus ad illos: Quid solvite pullum?

SAINT LUKE — CHAP. 19

29. And it came to pass, when he was come nigh to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount called *the mount of Olives*, he sent two of his disciples,

30. Saying, Go ye into the village over against *you*; in the which at your entering ye shall find a colt tied, whereon yet never man sat: loose him, and bring *him hither*.

31. And if any man ask you, Why do ye loose *him*? thus shall ye say unto him, Because the Lord hath need of him.

32. And they that were sent went their way, and found even as he had said unto them.

33. And as they were loosing the colt, the owners thereof said unto them, Why loose ye the colt?
