


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RAILS

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NIAGARA FALLS, ONT.—Engineer Jackson has submitted to Council a report on sewerage system for the old village; estimated cost, \$52,000.—F. Trelford will build a residence, corner of Victoria ave. and Simcoe street.

HALIFAX, N. S.—E. L. Thorne is acting as treasurer of the movement towards the founding of a home for aged men.—P. S. Archibald, C.E., has completed the survey for proposed International Railway branch to Mount Carlyle, N.B., six miles.

ST. CATHARINES, ONT.—The City Council will submit a by-law to the ratepayers to take \$20,000 stock in the Niagara, Queenston, and St. Catharines Railway Company which will build an electric railway from St. Catharines to Niagara-on-the-Lake.

BERLIN, ONT.—It is said that Constructions, Limited, of Toronto, will build a number of cheap houses here.—The Board of Trade will endeavor to secure the construction of a subway at the King street crossing of the Grand Trunk Railway.
