That is now giving satisfaction to those using them, I now introduce it for general use. The advantage it possesses ever the common press is, that in addition to the screw pressure, there is a constant steady pressure on the cheese as the box as shown in the engraving, is laden with stones. Thus, when the pressure of the screw slackens, as it invariably does by the settling of the curd, still the heavy weight continues, independent of the screw. The screws are made of either wood or iron, as preferred. The price of the single Press is \$6, with wooden screw; or \$9 with iron screw; in ranges of three complete sets for dairies, \$27, placed on board the cars.
