was directed to fubmit to the Houfe, whenever it should be pleased to receive the fame.

ORDERED, that the report be now received.

He accordingly read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered the fame, with the Bill, in at the Clerk's table, where the report was again read.

On motion of Mr. Bourdages, feconded by Mr. Papineau, junior;

ORDERED, that the question of concurrence be now separately put on the amendments reported by the Committee to the Bill.

And the faid amendments were again feverally read, and the queftion being feparately put upon each, they were agreed unto by the House.

ORDERED, that the Bill, as amended, be engroffed.

The order of the day for the Houfe to refolve into a Committee of the whole Houfe, on the Meffage from His Excellency the Governor in Chief to this Houfe, on the thirteenth inftant, intimating that *Pierre Bedard*, Efquire, elected to ferve as a Member for the County of Surrey, was apprehended and committed for treafonable practices, being read;

On motion of Mr. Bourdages, feconded by Mr. M. Caron ;

ORDERED, that the faid order of the day be postponed 'till Monday next.

RESOLVED, that this House will, on Monday next, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the said Message.

Then, on motion of Mr. Papineau, junior, feconded by Mr. Bruneau ;
