CHAP. I.

AN ACT to limit to a certain period the proceedings under an Act of the Parliament of this Province passed in the Fifty-fourth year of His late Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act to declare certain persons therein described Aliens, and to vest their Estates in His Majesty, and to afford further facilities to Claimants of Estates forfeited under the said Act in certain cases."

[Passed 25th March, 1828.]

WHEREAS it is expedient that the proceedings under a certain Act Preache's of the Parliament of this Province entitled, "An Act to declare certain Persons therein described Aliens, and to vest their Estates in His Majesty," should after a limited period be closed, and that certain facilities should be afforded to Claimants of Estates Forfeited under the said Act.
