

SPECIAL SERVICES CONDUCTED IN BAPTIST CHURCHES OF CITY

Rev. Gordon of Montreal Spoke in City at Morning and Evening Services on Sunday Last

The services held in Calvary Church on Sunday were indicative of the splendid hopeful spirit that characterizes the work there. The congregational singing was most enjoyable, the anthems sung by the choir were well rendered and appropriate, and the sermons stirring and timely.

The morning address, delivered by the pastor, Rev. W. E. Bowyer, on the subject "A Message of Assurance" was based on the words found in 2 Cor. 8:23, "Whether ye do enquire of Titus, he is my partner and fellow-helper concerning you; or our brethren be enquired of, they are the messengers of the churches, and the glory of Christ." In his introduction Mr. Bowyer showed that the apostle Paul appreciated the support of the Corinthian Christians in extending the progress of the gospel. So to-day the efforts of those engaged in the service of the Master are appreciated. Even though criticism is often levelled against the individual church member, it is yet recognized that the Church is the noblest institution of all time. The Church is and has been behind great philanthropic, social and moral reform movements. In these days of war, the Church, though she loves peace does not countenance a shameful and dishonorable peace, so in behalf of righteousness and justice she has sent her sons and daughters to the place of warfare to maintain her ideals.

Eliminate the church from the country and from the community, and the doors would be opened to confusion and anarchy.

In the application of the text, the speaker delivered himself as follows: Titus and the brethren were representatives of the Church.

1. The Church must be maintained on the co-operative plan. Partnership and fellowship must obtain. "We are laborers together with Him." In this co-operation there will be (1) a guiding intellect, (2) inspired by a loving heart, and (3) requiring a loyal obedience.

2. The Church must have a service of communication. Her work does not lie within the four walls of her building, but must be wider than that. It is the province of the messenger to communicate. The Church is a messenger, if she does not send forth the message she has no right to exist, and the most appropriate service—for such a dead church is a burial service. 3. The Church must manifest the glory of Christ.

This glory is a spiritual glory. It is not to be found primarily in the exercise of temporal or political power though the latter ought to be influenced by it. This glory is the possession and expression of the spirit of Christ. It is the effulgence of a transformed life. It is radiated from a personality that has been surrendered to the will of the heavenly Father.

It therefore should be the ambition of the Church to evidence the Christ likeness in all her activities. Such a conception of the Church would conduce to the realization of her divine mission.

In the evening Rev. G. H. Baker, of Montreal, spoke to a good congregation from Rev. 1:6-7, "Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood, and to whom we give glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen." In this text the character of Christ was set forth as that of an ordinary person, but was divine, his character was shown by His great love, His work was to redeem mankind, and to raise the status of humanity. Mr. Baker powerfully appealed to those who had not done so to accept the invitation of this great Saviour. The sermon was followed by a solo beautifully sung by Mrs. R. H. Martin.

Sunday was a good day in Park Baptist church. At the morning service the Rev. Dr. Gordon H. Baker, B.A., B.D., Pastor of the Temple Baptist Church of Montreal, was the preacher. preacher "then we will understand what the crucifixion really is—what it teaches." It teaches us that it included a tremendous sacrifice—God's sacrifice—who for and what for? For you and for me—for your sins and mine. It was God's sacrifice. Suppose a mother saw her son lay down his life on the field of battle for his King and Country, who would be the greatest sufferer—who would make the greatest sacrifice—the mother or the son? Oh, the mother, and so God made this sacrifice for us, in giving his only begotten son—Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God, made a sacrifice for the sin of the world, and your sins and mine of the great wonders of the Cross, and should cause us to think about it. Then again, the Value of the Cross. It is beyond everything in the world, and the whole of the world.

"When I survey the wondrous cross On which the Prince of Glory died, My richest gain I count but loss And pour contempt on all my pride. Forbid it Lord that I should boast, Save in the death of Christ, my God, All the vain things that charm me most, I sacrifice them to his blood." If we can come to this point, when we give up all the vain things that charm us most—these are not hateful mean sins, but the great pleasures, the charming things that lead us away from His service. If we can sit down and say "I sacrifice them to His blood," then will our hearts be set on fire the love of God and His service. "How many of you here to-day have sat down and considered what the Cross really means to you?" The vision of the Cross would fill our souls with reverence. The courage and the bravery of the Canadian boys at their recent great engagement on the Somme, caused distinguished men to say "Hats off to the Canadian boys." So when we consider the great victory won over the arch enemy, by the Captain of our Salvation through the Cross we can sing:

"In the cross of Christ I glory T'wixt the wrecks of time All a light of sacred story Gathers round its head sublime." This after all is but the negative side. Now for the positive.

"Were all the realms of nature mine That were a present far too small: Love so amazing, so divine Demands my soul, my life, my all."

"Can you say that 'Will you now make the surrender and lay upon the altar your soul, your life, your all: May God help us all so to do, then we shall be able to rejoice in the Cross."

At the close of the sermon, of which the foregoing is but a brief outline, the Rev. Dr. Hooper, the former esteemed and beloved pastor of Park Church, closed with the benediction. This is the first time Park Church has had the privilege of hearing this good, earnest and eloquent preacher (Rev. Mr. Baker) and we will gladly welcome him again at any time.

COMBLES FALLS AT LENGTH

Its Capture by British Was Imminent—Review of the Day's War News.

By Courier Lensed Wire.

London, Sept. 26.—British and French troops to-day reached the town of Combles, on the Somme front, after having virtually pocketed the place in a struggle of many weeks duration and are fighting to gain complete possession of it.

Attacking from the north, British troops have forced their way into the place and are overcoming the German resistance there. On the south the French have reached the town's edge and have penetrated the cemetery. In addition they have further closed the small opening left in the Combles pocket by capturing all of the village of Fregicourt, a mile to the east.

The Combles salient, doggedly maintained by the Germans has long been a serious hindrance to the allies, hampering them in their offensive toward Bapaume and Peronne. Its elimination, however, seemed imminent after yesterday's combined thrust by the Franco-British forces, which carried them to Morval on the one side and Fregicourt, on the other, leaving as a line of retreat for the Germans only a roadless gap a mile and a half in width swept by the allied guns.

Bombs dropped in last night's Zeppelin raid on England, carried out by some half dozen of these German air craft, caused the death of 29 persons, it was officially announced in London to-day.

While the great battle on the Somme front was at its height the Germans last night attacked the French lines at Verdun, driving in between the Thiaumont work and Henry to the east of the Meuse. Paris to-day announces that the French guns were effective in checking the German assaults.


