SIR THOMAS TAIT HAS RESIGNED Recently Appointed Director of National Service Quits. New Director Appointed Is Mr. R. B. Bennett.

Ottawa, Oct. 15.—It is announced officially that Sir Thomas Tait has resigned his position as director-general of the national service. He will be succeeded by Mr. R. B. Bennett, M.P.
