Present indications are that the Irrigation Convention to be held in Vernon, B, C., during the week beginning August 10th, will be one of the most important gather- Jno. Sloan ings of the kind that has ever been held in Western Canada. Among the notables, whose attendance will contribute to the prestige of the gathering are Lieutenant Gov. ernor Bulyea of Alberta and Lieutenant-Governor Forget of Clyde Brown Saskatchewan. Hon. F. J. Fulton, Chief Commissioner of Lands and Works. It is expected also that there will be a particularly strong representation of irrigation and forestry experts, official members of Land and colonization organizations, and others particularly interested in the important subjects of irrigation and water legislation.

It is to be hoped that local Irrigation and Irrigation Colonization Companies, agricultural, horticultural, forestry and live stock associations, municipal corporations, boards of Trade and similar organizations will lose no time in appointing the number of delegates to which each is entitled. There is scarcely a section of Canada which is not directly in terested in problems connected with the distribution and consentration of water forestry etc., and all should make a point of taking advantage of their right of representation at this important Convention.

Coal.—Coal lands may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents per ton of 2000 pounds shall be collected on the gross output.


