British Launches the Largest  
Teeth Monster Warship.

The gigantic battleship-cruiser Lion has been laid down to-day noon at Devonport, England. She is the greatest battleship ever built, exceeding all existing Dreadnoughts in size, speed and armament.

**STAVES UP**

The Lion is officially described as an ironclad liner. It is designed for every battle ship in the world; however, and is the naval model of the new Dreadnoughts.

The Lion is the first battleship to be armed with guns of 15.5 inches, 13.5 inch guns, which are arranged in four batteries on the center of the ship. The two middle batteries are raised so as to give them gun power to fire over other battleships. This system will allow the crew of the vessel to turn the guns in any direction.

The guns will fire projectiles of 2,500 pounds a distance of 12,000 yards. These projectiles will penetrate 22 inch armor. The Lion has a displacement of 26,000 tons. The 160-foot long battleship breadth 52 feet.

The horse-power of the Lion will be 70,000 and the speed will be 30 knots. She will be fitted with the Parsons turbines and will have forty-five water-tube boilers situated amidships and will be supplied with nine incandescent oil burners.

The Lion is the latest British Dreadnought to be launched. She cost \$14,000,000. The cost of the ship and cost \$22,150,000, or \$10,55,000.
