SIR A. GEDDES WILL ACCEPT MCGILL CHAIR

British Minister of Reconstruction to Become Principal of Montreal University.

London, March 22.—According to The Daily Express Sir Auckland Geddes has been offered and will accept the Principalship of McGill University. Sir Auckland is at present Minister of Reconstruction and the Coalition Unionist member for Basinstoke. He has had a varied and distinguished career as a soldier and a statesman. He served with the R.A.M.C. in the South African war, and afterwards went to McGill University as a Professor in Anatomy. At the outbreak of war he joined the army as private and served in France. He became a Brigadier-General when he took charge of recruiting at the War Office.

He discarded his military title on becoming Minister of National Service in August, 1917. He is a brother of Sir Eric Geddes, Minister without portfolio in the Lloyd George Cabinet.

It boasts the winning of a Victoria Cross, Sergeant Miner having been awarded that honor for the capture of two machine guns.

FOCH GIVES ALL CREDIT TO SOLDIERS

"Rhine or Defeat" Says French Marshal in Speaking of Armistice—Victories "By Faith."

Paris, March 22.—"The Rhine is our only good line of defense I do not demand annexation, but if we do not secure that military frontier we will have fought in vain," is a statement made by Marshal Foch, quoted in an interview printed in the Matin today.

In discussing the last days of the war, the Marshal said:

"It was the wonderful soldiers who gave us victory. My only merit was to have had faith and never to have despaired. We signed the armistice, in spite of the certainty of crushing the German armies, to avoid killing one more man and because it gave us everything necessary to a French victory."

Victories "By Faith."

Marshal Foch was reminded today that March 21 was the anniversary of the beginning of the great German offensive toward Amiens, and was asked by Jules Sauterwin of the Matin to explain by what methods the Marshal had turned the offensive into a German defeat. The allied generalissimo replied:

"You ask me to tell you much in a few words. Victories are won by science, that is true, but also by faith. When one has faith, one does not require; one stops the enemy where one finds him.

"You tell me that I gave victory to France. It was our admirable soldiers who gave it. I have but one merit, that of never despairing."

London, March 21.—At the annual meeting of the Grand Trunk Railway yesterday Alfred W. Smithers, the chairman, said the Canadian Government had offered for the property an annuity of \$997,000 immediately, plus what an arbitrator might give, over and above that amount, or an immediate annual payment of £1,163,000 without arbitration.

The meeting unanimously passed a resolution that the amount offered by the Canadian Government for the purchase of the railway was inadequate.
