

## TEMPERANCE ITEMS.

Clipped by the Editors of the *Goderich*  
W.C.T.U.

Six of the United States absolutely prohibit the manufacture and sale of alcoholic beverages.

The New South Wales, Australia, temperance people are jubilant over the result of their recent general election by which so many members favorable to local option have been elected. They feel certain that a bill giving the veto power to the people will soon be passed through parliament.

At the confirmation of 1,400 children recently held in the Roman Catholic Cathedral, at Dublin, Ireland, Archbishop Walsh administered the total abstinence pledge to the whole of the candidates, and warned them earnestly against the evils of drink.

The temperance movement appears to be making substantial progress in England, according to the Government returns. In making his budget speech the other day the chancellor of the exchequer stated that the yearly consumption of alcohol had decreased by \$22,500,000 in ten years. At the same time the receipts from articles really required by the people increased, and the public debt was reduced by \$180,000,000 in five years. The decrease in the consumption of liquor caused an enormous falling off in the revenue, but it is one-half counterbalanced by an increased revenue from tea, etc., although the duties remain the same.

The following is from the report of the president of the Ontario Agricultural College: In my last report, I alluded to the effect of smoking on young men at college. A very considerable number of our students smoke, and not a few of them are confirmed in the habit. At present I shall not discuss the question, but simply state one or two facts regarding the record of smokers and non-smokers in this institution. In 1884 and 1885, 58 of our students received departmental honors; and 46 of these were non-smokers. Within the last five years, 67 have taken diplomas, and 48 of them have won medals, and 12 of them have been non-smokers and non-drinkers.

On Saturday, May 1st, the Scott Act went into operation in about three-fourths of the Province of Ontario. In addition to the nine Ontario counties in which the Act is already in force, two cities and sixteen counties and union of counties will be brought under its operation. They are as follows:—Cities of Guelph and St. Thomas; Counties of Brant, Leeds and Grenville, Kent, Lanark, Lennox and Addington, Carleton, Durham, and Northumberland, Elgin, Lambton, Wellington, Frontenac, Lincoln, Middlesex, Ontario, Victoria and Peterborough.

A SAD SIGHT—As early as ten o'clock this Thursday morning (April 29, 1886), a man who once held a good position, and who has few superiors as a mechanic, was seen rolling about the streets in a beastly state of intoxication. Of late years he has been a heavy drinker, and it is a rare thing to find him sober. He is rough to his family, and people expected long before this to have heard of him doing some harm. Hotelkeepers have been forbidden to give him liquor, but he seems to get it all the same. The case is one which really demands the attention of the Women's Christian Temperance Society, or some other body that claims to look after the fallen.—*Mitchell Advocate*. They have no Scott Act in Mitchell.

It used to be said that the best French brandy was only Canada whisky made over. But according to M. Girard, chief municipal laboratory of Paris, the stuff now largely sent out to a confounding world is of more inferior quality. He says, "From 1840 to 1850 about 25,000,000 gallons of brandy were made yearly in France, and fully seven-eighths came from grapes. At present more than 50,000,000 gallons are yearly turned out, but not one per cent. of it is made from the grape; grain, cider, beet, potatoes, &c., forming its principal ingredients. The spirits thus obtained would be fairly wholesome if they were properly rectified. But they are not. Invariably when put upon the market they are charged with acids, ethers and essential oils, of the most deadly nature." The startling increase of violent insanity and other maladies in France, of late years, is by M. Girard attributed to consumption of this deadly brandy.

Our friends in the Dominion, says the *Christian Leader*, will be amused to learn that the Edinburgh *Scotsman* advises local optionists to "study the remarkable breakdown of the Scott Act in Canada." The print in question would like the Act to break down, so it invents the fiction that it has broken down. This is one of its old tricks. Well do we recollect how it adopted the same kind of expedient in its bitter opposition to the Forbes-Mackenzie bill, in the resistance that it offered to the repeal of the taxes upon knowledge, and in many other conflicts in which it espoused the cause of the wrong against the right. Lately we have seen how unscrupulous its tactics have been against the Highland crofters; but in this matter, as in all others, its opposition has proved futile. It will hardly succeed in destroying the Scott Act, saying that it has broken down; and Scotland will for three decades have local option as she has for three decades had the Forbes Mackenzie Act.
