

PUBLIC NOTICE!

The Newfoundland Agricultural Board has ascertained that certain plots of potatoes in the neighbourhood of St. John's are affected by the dreaded

"Potato Canker" Disease.

This is the same disease that was first detected at Red Island, in Placentia Bay, about a year ago, and is so fatal in its effects that if not immediately checked the absolute impossibility of growing potatoes in Newfoundland for years to come, is sure to result.

The Agricultural Board therefore requests that all potato growers who may observe indications of disease in their crop will at once notify the Secretary of the Agricultural Board at the office of the Department of Agriculture and Mines.

The Agricultural Board recognizing the incalculable injury that must accrue to the country if this disease be not immediately stamped out earnestly requests all persons to aid the efforts now about to be made to effect this.

In February last the Agricultural Board issued an illustrated pamphlet from a special report by Professor Gussow on this disease. Some thousands of copies were sent to Outport Magistrates and Glergymen, and the Board now requests that potato growers in any affected Districts will procure a copy of this report and be guided by its recommendations.
