War News.

Messages Received Previous to 9 a m

OFFICIAL.

The Governor, Newfoundland:

LONDON, April 23.

The general attack on the Dardanelles was resumed yesterday by the Fleet and Army. The Army's landing, covered by the fleet, began before sunrise at various points, on the Gallipoli peninsula. Despite serious opposition from strong entrenchments protected by barbed wire, it was completely successful. Large forces were established on shore before night. Landing of the army and the advance continue.

The French Government reports counter-attacks near Ypres. They have regained part of the lost ground. The village of Lizerne, captured by the Germans on the left bank of the Yser Canal, was recaptured by Zouaves and Belgian Carabineers. Appreciable progress has been made on the right bank of the Canal. The British troops have maintained all their positions on our right.

Enemy attacks in Champagne, Argonne and the heights of the Meuse have failed.

THE ANNUAL BUDGET.

LONDON, April 26.

Chancellor Lloyd George will announce the annual budget on May 6th. On Wednesday he will make his promised statement on the drink question.

KITCHENER'S APPEAL.

LONDON, April 26.

Lord Kitchener to-day issued another appeal to the employees of the Vickers Works to make munitions of war at full pressure. The battle in Flanders has caused an enormous expenditure of ammunition.

ZEPPELIN PROCEEDING IN DIRECTION OF ENGLAND.

AMSTERDAM, April 26.

A Zeppelin airship flew over the island of Schiermonnikoog to-day, proceeding eastward in the direction of England.

PROTEST AGAINST EMPLOYMENT OF WOMEN.

CARDIFF, April 26.

At a mass meeting of street carmen held yesterday, resolutions were passed, protesting against the employment of women Conductors, and warning the City Council that if it persists in its policy of using women as Conductors, the men will refuse to work with them.

ST. PIERRE BULLETIN.

PARIS, via St. Pierre, April 26. In Belgium two German attacks debouching from Passchendalle and Brodseinde have been checked by British troops. The enemy then shelled fiercely at Ypres. Our action continues along the Yser Canal. At Notre Dame de Lorette we repulsed a German attack. On heights of the Mousse a battle is developing. The German attack on Calonne trench, reported yesterday, has been checked by our counter-attack and the enemy thrown back. The latter then attacked further east towards Saint Remy, evidently aiming at the recapture of Eparges. A fierce action, preceded by a heavy cannonading, was engaged in shortly after on the eastern slopes of this position, but the German attack failed.

Ten Masked Men

Held Up Fast Freight on New York Central, and With Ten Auto Trucks Get Away With Goods.

Buffalo, N.Y., April 15.—Ten masked and armed men held up a New York Central fast freight train near Sanborn, fifteen miles from this city, early this morning. They uncoupled the engine and ran it a quarter of a mile down the tracks and kept the train crew covered while the cars were looted. Ten big automobile trucks were in waiting and were filled with stolen goods.

Engineer Goss, of Syracuse, who was running the train, escaped from his guard and ran down the tracks with the robbers firing at him. He reached the engine and started it, running to Suspension Bridge, eight miles away, and secured a posse of detectives and was back to the scene within half an hour. Hundreds of armed men began scouring the country for the robbers, but none of them have been arrested. Several shots were fired at the train crew.

The stolen goods were worth thousands of dollars. The autos came from the direction of Buffalo, and a call for help was sent to the city. Every highway leading into the city was guarded, but no track of the machines was found.

"German Vote" Failed to Work.

The recent majority election in Chicago has been one of the straw which shows how the wind is blowing in the United States as regards the use of the "German-American" vote. The Democratic candidate,

Robert M. Schweitzer, was nominated in the hope that the "German vote" of Chicago, which is nearly a third of the total vote of the city, would rally to his support as a means of demonstrating the solidarity of the Germans in the United States. Hundreds of the leading German and Austrian citizens, says the New York Times, "signed a circular urging the voters of German, Austrian, and Hungarian descent to vote the Schweitzer ticket as an endorsement of the war policies of Kaiser Wilhelm. The circular was adorned with photographs of Kaiser Wilhelm and Emperor Francis Joseph."

"An intense wave of resentment arose. The young Americans from the Indiana borders of Chicago to the northern borders of Chicago at Lake Forest turned out in force and voted down the Schweitzer German-Austrian ticket."

As a result, William Hale Thompson, the Republican candidate, was elected by the unheard plurality of 139,000 votes.
