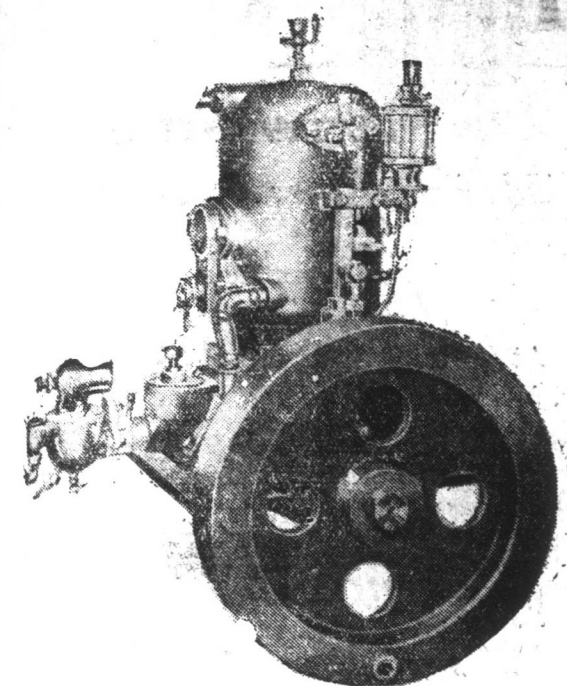

Western Notes.

It is understood that a permanent appointment is shortly to be made to the Channel Post Office. Under the present official, the work has been done very satisfactorily, and any change cannot be for the better. Let the authorities take note of this.

Poor weather hampers operations of fishermen between Channel and Rose Blanche. Bait also continues scarce, though some fresh herring are being shipped from Bay of Islands. Unfortunately fishing conditions are so uncertain that most of this supply is spoiled ere it can be used. Strong currents too hamper trawling and much gear has been lost.

Four men were recently brought from Rose Blanche to Channel to serve out sentences of thirty days imprisonment each in the latter jail for forcibly taking several sacks of flour for their families alive. During their incarceration the Government has, of course, to keep their dependents.
