The Juvenile Delinquents Act of Canada passed in 1908, states in its preamble that "it is not expedient that youthful offenders should be classified or dealt with as ordinary criminals."

The Juvenile Delinquents Act was enacted to make this possible. It, however, does not come into force in any municipality or Province except at the request of the local authorities and on proclamation of the Governor in Council.
