or both, contemplate a renewal of the movement against the temporal power of the Pope at no distant day. Most important consequences would certainly result from such a step if taken just now. It would compel Napoleon to make good his diaim of filial obedience to the Holy See and also solve the September Convention either for the certection or ruin of Italian unity. The Church may be affected even in its ecolesiastical anticipations, for if he new France Papal camp is not ompleted it may not be prudent to seemble the priestly representatives of the Catholic world in general council even in 1869.

The Hudson Bay Company and the Proposed Transfer.

Speaking of the proposed transfer the Hudson's Bay Company territory to the British Government the Pall Mall Gazette says:

The shareholders in the Hudson's Bay Company will probably not be untilling to come to terms with the overnment concerning the cession of he monopoly. In the course of five ears the dividend has never been igher than 4½ per cent, and this year t is only 3. There was a time when he company grew rich on its trade, or none of it could be diverted from he proper channels, and the agents ere active and vigorous men. It would be difficult now to carry on such trade over a vast extent of country rithout some little loss. A share-older thinks the Government ought pay at least £1,300,000 for the Company's rights in Rupert's Land, and Lord Kimberly promises to make a good a bargain for them as he posibly can. Whatever sum may be ulimately fixed upon for compensation, he proprietors are acting very wisely a preparing for the inevitable change, there had been a native population of mutiny against them they would ave had their 'rights' absorbed long go. There are certainly political sasons why, for the sake of settling his question, the Government should eal with the Company in a liberal pirit.
