WIVES SHOULD FLIRT WITH THEIR HUSBANDS

London, May 15.—Lady McLaren asserts that wives should flirt with their husbands. And as Lady McLaren is the authoress of the "Women's Charter," as they term the nine bills bearing on the liberties and rights of women, which Sir Charles McLaren sponsored in the House of Commons, her affirmation that this home flirtation proposition is the secret of domestic bliss has attracted more than passing attention and discussion.

"Every man," said she, "wants a wife who is never too overburdened to hook her neck straight and wear a clean collar and laugh and flirt with her husband."

"Many husbands and wives, after a few years of matrimony, settle down into a sort of dull, colorless respectability," said Lady Troubridge, the well known novelist, in approving Lady McLaren's contention. "Frankly, they lose interest in each other; they need waking up. A clever wife could prevent just such a catastrophe by judiciously flirting with her husband. But by flirting I do not mean the reviving of the kittenish airs and graces of 'sweet seventeen.' An attempt of that kind might have exactly an opposite effect."

"I mean she should flatter him occasionally, tell him that he is a very good fellow, show him plainly that her love and affection for him are even stronger than in their courtship days. It is a well known fact that to love is much better than to be in love. The former is a full grown tree in the earth. Happy husbands and wives realize this truth. Flirtation keeps them young hearted and gay. Indeed, I believe in wives flirting with their husbands."

"Flirting between husband and wife would bore them both to death," insisted a prominent bon vivant, one of the cynics of a West End club, but who exacted a pledge that his name would not appear in print. "I don't think it is fair to expect the roses and raptures of love to outlive the first years of married life. After a few years of matrimony no woman's heart beats quickly when she hears her husband's foot upon the stair. And I don't see what good is going to be got by her pretending that it does. This flirting would bore both husband and wife. It would be an empty, hollow farce. It would be lamb without mint sauce."

"I certainly believe with Lady McLaren that wives should flirt with their husbands," said a well known authoress. "But there should be a stipulation that such flirtations should be held in private. Husbands and wives who persist in carrying out flirtations at 'at home' and at dinners should be tabooed from society. Such people sit and talk with each other, dance together and generally ignore every one else."

There are many ways of flirting. For instance, a man may bring his wife a bunch of flowers and thus do more good toward restoring domestic happiness than hours of conversation. I do not advocate the silly kissing and cuddling of courtship days, but an occasional caress between husband and wife banishes the worries and discontents of life."

EX-PRESIDENT TELLS OF REVOLUTION

Pathetic Letter of One of the American Victims of the Nicaraguan Rising

New York, May 15.—Copies of former President Zelaya's book on the revolution in Nicaragua, which he has been engaged in writing since his precipitate retirement from office, occupies the center of the stage in the little Spanish-American colony here. The book, which is in Spanish, has just been published in Madrid and is intended as a justification of the former president.

To Americans the most interesting portion of the book is the appendix which gives several long extracts from Zelaya's correspondence. Among the exhibits is a letter written by the American, Groce, to his mother in the United States, just before he was executed. It was confiscated by the Nicaraguan officials and the mother never received it. It is as follows:

"El Castillo Fortress, San Juan River, Nicaragua, November 16, 1909.
"My Darling Mama—This will be a terrible blow to you—the last word you will ever receive from your wayward son. I can't write much, as I am too nervous and have only a few minutes to live. I joined the revolu-

tion in Bluefields and was captured and sentenced to be shot to death. I will be executed together with a young man from Virginia, Leroy Cannon. It will take place this morning at 10 o'clock.

"Now, mother dear, bear up. This is my fate—the results of war and disobedience to a loving mother. It's hard to be shot like this, but I will die like a man. Tell all good-bye; it is impossible for me to write more.

"Love and kisses as the last farewell on earth to you, dear mother, all the boys and dear little sister. Good-bye until we meet again in heaven.

"LEONARD."
There appear two other interesting letters in the book, one by Groce to his Nicaraguan wife, the other from Cannon to Juan Jacoby, of Mississippi. Zelaya prints these letters without any comment, probably resting his defence of the charge of unlawfully putting the men to death on the admission that they were in the insurrection.

Wireless Telegraph Operators and Vessel Operators Warned

Detroit, Mich., May 17.—The United States Hydrographic office has cautioned wireless telegraph operators and vessel masters along the lakes, that wireless instruments and compasses may be affected by atmospheric conditions caused by Halley's comet. Both operators and captains are expected to take careful logs between the 18th and 20th, recording static effects and magnetic variations. The sighting of meteors should be promptly reported in detail.
