## MISS NETHERSOLE HELPS

Special Matinees for Benefit of Old London's Unemployed.

Toronto, Nov. 14.—Miss Olga Nethersole, who arrived in Toronto yesterday morning and read of Queen Alexandra's subscription of \$10,000 towards London's unemployed, and her appeal for funds to her subjects, decided to devote the entire proceeds of special matinees here and in Montreal to the fund.

She cabled as follows to the Queen: "Am privileged in answering your majesty's appeal on behalf of England's unemployed, giving the proceeds of special matinees this and coming weeks, Toronto and Montreal, in aid of the fund."

A special matinee will accordingly be given on Friday night, the 18th inst., at the Princess Theatre management and staff.

## ATTACKS LANSOWNE

An Austrian Paper Regards Him as Making Effort to Prove War.

London, Nov. 13.—Lord Lansdowne has been made the object of a bitter attack in the leading Austrian papers for his alleged action in endeavoring to incite war between France and Germany. There are no new issues, but the paper says: "No more than Macbeth will Lansdowne be able to purge from his raiment the stain of which he has to thank his French friend and accomplice, Delcasse, Lansdowne played with the awful idea of a double war which might have grown into a universal war. That is the stigma from which he will never be able to rid himself, and no denial will prevent the memory of Delcasse from fastening upon him this idea, and drawing him down in company with the blinded and criminal disturber of the peace, from whom his own people shrink in horror as he learned of the nameless war which he was about to perpetrate."

This is said to have been inspired by Prince Von Buelow, and the Times declares it to be the beginning of a campaign for the removal of Lord Lansdowne from the foreign office here, in the same way as M. Delcasse was driven from the Quai d'Orsay. In view of the ravaging anti-German feeling that now pervades Great Britain, high and low, it begins to look more like an attempt to really strengthen the position of Lord Lansdowne, and it is not conceivable that the German chancellor could so stupidly imagine that it could have any other effect, once its origin is supposed to be German.
