COAL TRAIN HITS CAR AT STREET CROSSING

Half Dozen Killed in Disastrous Accident on Lake Shore at Ashtabula.

[Canadian Press.] Dec. 17. — The Ashtabula, Ohio, Dec. bodies of six women have been taken from the wreckage of a street car which was struck at the Centre street crossing here last night by a north-bound Lake Shore and Michigan Southern coal train, Under the wreckage of twenty loaded coal cars are thought to be the bodies of three more women and one man. None of the five injured was in a serious condition early today. The buckling of a train caused the coal cars to pile up to a height of nearly forty feet over the wreckage of the street car. Witnesses of the accident say that the gates of the crossing were not lowered, al-though Conductor Mullen, of the car, was on the track, frantically signalling Motorman McCutcheon to stop. Engineer D. E. O'Connor and Fireman Herchberger, both of Erie, Pa., jumped from their engine after setting the brakes, and neither was injured. The impetus of the heavily-loaded coal cars pushed the engine on, and portions of a residence, a warehouse, and a store, near the crossing, were molished. Railroad officials say that it will take many hours' work to remove the pile of over 10.000 tons of coat. which is thought to cover the bodies
