

WILL ISSUE WRIT FOR BY-ELECTION

OTTAWA, Feb. 10.—(By Canadian Press.)—A writ for the by-election in East Kootenay will probably be issued tomorrow. The date of the by-election was decided on at a meeting of the cabinet council late this afternoon, but announcement of it was withheld pending approval by his excellency the governor-general, who is not at present in the city.

Whether or not Hon. J. H. King, minister of public works, will be opposed in East Kootenay is not known here. Robert E. Beattie, member for the riding, accepted an appointment to the income tax department branch of the finance department at Vancouver, thus creating the vacancy.

[Special To London Advertiser.] CAIRO, Egypt, Feb. 10.—Egypt today is menacing the peace and safety of the British Empire.

Egypt wants independence. And it has 13,000,000 people, mostly Mohammedans.

Religion is a big factor in the Egyptian situation, for trouble with the Moslems there means unrest

among the Mohammedans of India.

Boycott is the newest weapon the Egyptians have adopted—as the Sinn Feiners did with Ulster, as Ghandi's followers are doing in India.

Leaders in the Egyptian unrest are Seyid Zaghlul Pasha, representative of the extreme nationalists, and Adly Pasha, representative of the moder-

ates.

TAKE STAND TO FIGHT PROPOSED GAS RATE BOOST

Elgin Organizations Join Forces in Effort Against Combine.

WANT 1921 ACT REVISED

Pass Resolution Demanding Change Be Made in Present Legislation.

ST. THOMAS, Feb. 10.—Members of the Elgin County Municipal Association have joined forces with other organizations of the county in the fight against the natural gas companies of southwestern Ontario and the natural gas act of 1921.

As the result of this action, at the annual meeting of the organization in the court house of this city the following resolution was passed unanimously:

"That in the opinion of the 14th annual convention of the Elgin Municipal Association the natural gas act of 1921 should be repealed, owing to the fact that existing municipalities, individuals and the gas companies are ignored; and that the secretary be instructed to forward copies of the resolution to the minister of mines and to President Drury at the earliest possible date."

BEARS EXPLORER'S BODY TO GRAVE

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay, Feb. 10.—The British whaling supply steamer Woodville will leave Montevideo next Wednesday, taking on board the body of Sir Ernest Shackleton, the British explorer, for burial on South Georgia Island, the gateway to the Antarctic Ocean.

This announcement was made today by Captain Hussey of the exploration steamer Quest, on board which Shackleton died off South Georgia Island Jan. 5, and who brought the body to Montevideo.
