The Deaf Mutes at Winnipeg.

To the Editor of The World. Sra. You have an article in to-day's insue headed Extraordinary if True, say-ing that a number of deaf mutes had arrived at Winnipeg from England and others were to follow. Some time ago information of this scheme reached me from England, but the details were so vague that I was unable to be sure about much hevond the fact that fifty deaf mutes were ing out. I at once wrote to Mr. Matheson, principal of the Belleville institution, saying enquiry should be made, and if necessary something done to stop it. Mr. Matheson forwarded my letter to the For Persons Residing Anywhere Mr. Matheson forwarded my letter to the Toronto emigration agent, who called on me to enquire, but as I was not able to give much information I advised him to write to London himself and have enquiry made. This he said he would do. I also wrote to Mr. Rhind chaplain of the London D. D. peinting out the poor outlook for deaf mutes in Toronto owing to slackness of trade. Mr. Rhind replied to my note to the effect that the scheme was the work of a Miss Groom and neither he nor his association had anything neither he nor his association had anything to do with it, he would forward my letter but could do no more. Later I heard that Miss Groom had bought a quarter section of 640 acres with the intention of having it worked by the mutes. I quite agree with your opinion that it is a very hazardous experiment, and it is a question if further importation of this class should not be stonged. It appears to me it would be importation of this class should not be stopped. It appears to me it would be doing a kindness to the mutes as well as an act of fairness to the country to do so always excepting those who have been brought up to agricultural pursuits.

But I must beg to take exception at your statement that deaf mutes instead of supporting themselves and doing something besides can scarcely help being a burden on others and a loss to the country.

I am not aware that there is at present in Toronto more than one deaf-mute to whom this would apply. They are

an toronto more than one deaf-mute to whom this would apply. They are almost without exception industrious and self-supporting, many are married and bring up families as well or better than their hearing fellows. They are also ready to help each other so that little is required to be done by the outside world. No doubt they have greater all families. to be done by the outside world. No doubt they have greater difficulty in obtaining work and are some slight tax on the good nature of their fellows and employers. They, however, compensate for this by getting rather lower pay, and I cannot but regard it as however immediately an insuft to compare a respectable and honest section of the community with the indelent emigrants of Conway street. dolent emigrants of Conway street.
