

SEVENTY MORE CASES.

NINETEEN DEATHS IN A DAY FROM SMALLPOX.

The Opinion of an English Physician—Opening of the Public Schools—Deaths from Smallpox.

Smallpox, Aug. 26.—There were 19 deaths from smallpox yesterday, being a larger number recorded since the disease was first reported.

A woman walked into the city hall to-day bearing marks of smallpox and asked where the health department was. Of course there was a regular stampede.

The case against the Hon. J. H. Hughes for leaving down placards has been postponed until Saturday.

A hospital ward was opened to-day as the new addition to the civic hospital will not be ready for some days. There are 50 patients in the hospital 149 of whom are progressing favorably.

A large number of cases have been found to exist on St. Jean Baptiste village, there being several cases in some houses.

The protestant and catholic boards of school commissioners have both decided to postpone the opening of the public schools until the 15th Sept.

A case has broken out in St. Charles hospital. A young girl, recently recovered from smallpox, was discovered sitting in Bonaventure station.

She said she was going on to the hospital, but was promptly dismissed by the station agent, who told her she could not get on the train until she had a sanitary certificate that there was no danger from contagion.

The corporation of the village of St. Anne's, Bellevue, are endeavoring to have immediate vaccination of all inhabitants of the municipality.

The sanitary police are no longer allowed on the streets, and are now confined to the cars to-day, threatening an action for damages.

Dr. James Edmunds, medical officer of health and public analyst for St. James, London, is at present in the city. Dr. Edmunds speaking of the smallpox epidemic in Montreal said it is not so serious as it was because they had not taken means to enforce vaccination as was done in England.

He held that vaccination was the only means of eradicating smallpox because it has the most powerful if not an absolute preventive of the disease. He advocated more stringent measures and also the erection of small pox hospitals. Twenty new cases were reported to-day.

The coming traction engine. On Monday the Joseph Hall machine works received their new Wood, Taber & Morse traction engine at Ottawa station, when it was put to its first test by hauling a load of lumber over a series of freight on a dirty road with only 40 lbs. of steam up, as a good speed.

Yesterday the engine was put through a series of severe tests, among which may be mentioned the placing of four road wheels at one time in holes 18 inches deep, and when started, the engine came out quite easily. An 8-inch scumming was placed before each wheel, which was easily surmounted, backward and forward. It has only run three new model threshers, three ordinary 12-hp engines and tender. Orders have already been received for the engine, and while it is first and great demand will be for threshing machine men to move their engines without the assistance of horses, and for ploughing and other heavy work.

The Joe Hall Machine works are manufacturing this machine, which is considered about the most perfect and valuable traction engine ever invented.

CANADA'S NIAGARA PARK.

The Point That Will Probably Be Reached.

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont., Aug. 26.—Much curiosity was exhibited to-day by the residents and property owners of this place regarding the action of the Canadian Niagara Falls park commission as to the lands to be taken for the proposed park.

A meeting of the commission was held at the Prospect hotel, the result of which was not made public, but there is every reason to believe the park will extend from the ferry road, near the new suspension bridge up to the burning spring, a distance of about two miles, and back to the brow of the bluff, and including Clark hill and the railway and the museum, park and buildings. The acreage will greatly exceed that of the American reservation, while the cost is not expected to reach the \$1,000,000.

The Commission adjourned this afternoon and will shortly have their preliminary report ready to submit to the Ontario government. Should the report receive the approval of the government the commission will then commence the work of valuing the property and placing the results of their labors before the Ontario legislature at its next session.

It is the prevailing supposition that the Canadian reservation will be opened free to the public on the 1st July, 1885.

A Trunk Stolen. PRINCETON, N. J., Aug. 26.—Charles Thompson, a French Canadian, who has been a porter at some of the leading hotels at Ocean Grove and Asbury Park this season, and who lately escaped with money and valuable trunks belonging to the guests, was captured near Rocky Hill after a hard struggle by officers from Monmouth county, who took the train from here this afternoon with their prisoner for Freehold jail. The guests at the hotel would let him have their trunks to the station and have them checked, and would also send money to purchase tickets in advance of their coming. The last time he did not return with either checks, money, or tickets. One of the trunks was valued at \$300, and was owned by a Philadelphia lady.

The Shattered People Perish. WASHINGTON, D.C., Aug. 26.—Details of the destruction in Canton, China, and vicinity, by the recent great rain storm there, have been received by private parties here. The flood was the most serious which has visited Canton in thirty years. More than 10,000 persons lost their lives, and a far greater number are left in a starving condition. Entire villages are engulfed, and the rice and silk crops in the vicinity are ruined. The price of rice advanced 18 per cent in consequence.

Bees in India. From the London Standard.

The Englishman, of Calcutta, states that the experiment made by Mr. J. C. Douglas, who has imported five millions of bees, has been crowned with complete success. He has been to three admirals, who at Calcutta, and have yielded during the present season eighty pounds of splendid honey. This is considered to be a proof that the honey industry may be established in India, and a new industry placed at the disposal of the millions of its land cultivators. We fear that the experiment of establishing bees in countries of perpetual summer has been tried before now, and has failed signally. For a time the best work was done, but as the year end to year's end the flowers offer a daily supply of nectar, he ceases to store up honey. Indeed, the bees do other things, but do not produce honey. It is to our respect as an industrious and thrifty creature. Did he labor as he does, he would be a most successful beekeeper. For time to store up honey for his winter use, and to do so he must be able to store up himself to be but an idiotic kind of insect, and in no way superior in moral status to the human miser.
