### THE PROPERTY COMMITTEE.

#### SHALL THE NEW CIVIC BUILDINGS BE FIREPROOF?

A lively discussion among the members of the Property Committee assembled yesterday afternoon at the request of the Toronto Drying Company for a 45-year lease of two lots on the lake shore in front of High Park, in return for which it would build an Esplanade and make other improvements, was again considered, it having been sent back by the Executive for further information.

"Let us throw it out entirely," said Ald. Lynde. "There is a beautiful beach there and it would be a great mistake if the city allowed it to pass out of its hands."

Ald. McMurich moved that the matter be not considered, while Ald. Jolliffe pleaded that it should be sent on to council.

The request of E. A. Colleton of the Toronto Ice Co. for a lease of the east end of Ashbridge's Bay was again referred back to ascertain the position of the Ontario Government in the matter.

Mr. J. E. Smith was granted a renewal of his lease at the southeast corner of Front and Bay-streets for a term of 21 years at \$1074 per annum. The price is thus computed: Of the feet of frontage 25 feet, commencing at the corner, is charged for at the rate of \$30 a foot and the balance, at feet, at \$14. The previous rate was \$5.40 per foot.

The New Civic Buildings.

Archibald Lennox submitted his report regarding the new civic buildings. He said that during the two and a half months he had had charge of the works much more had been accomplished than was expected. Not only were the condemned stone walls of the building, but in addition to all this it was carried up several feet into the second story. The building was raised almost half a story on the west half.

He shows that by the carrying on of the work by day labor there has been a saving of 24 per cent. in brick work and 20 per cent. in mason work.

Proceeding, the report says: "I consider it advisable to ask your committee to decide at once as to the course of action it wishes me to pursue—whether to continue the work by day labor or by contract."

A lengthy discussion followed the reading of the report.

"What I want to know," added Mr. Lennox in reply to a query, "is, shall I continue as I am or shall I take it tenders until the lawsuit is settled? And then we're free to do as we please."

Ald. McMurich moved that the matter be not further considered until the City Solicitor had been consulted.

Ald. Jolliffe said that if the architect could do the work as cheaply by day labor as it could be done by contract and would furnish proper security he was in favor of its being so done.

Ald. Small: Don't you think, Mr. Chairman, that it is now opportune to try and effect a compromise? For my part, I am in favor of the day labor.

"Well, if you think so, it is ill-advised for you to publicly say so," indignantly remarked Ald. McMurich.

Ald. Hewitt expressed himself as favorable to the work being carried on as at present until the pending litigation was settled.

The Mayor: I think the proper course for us to take is to put tenders for the completion of the work.

"Without consulting the Solicitor?" queried Ald. McMurich.

The Mayor: Yes, for I don't think there is the slightest possibility of the contractor succeeding in his suit against the city. We can call for tenders, and then if the architect says he can carry on the work cheaper by day labor why let him do it.

Ald. Jolliffe moved that the architect be instructed forthwith to prepare plans and
