The Indian Census.

In no part of the British Empire is the task of census-taking so arduous and difficult as in India. This happens not on account of the number and density of the population and its many differences in race, religion and language, but of the prevailing ignorance and prejudice regarding the character and purpose of process. This has been usually associated with the intention to increase taxation or in some other way to herald an interference with cherished customs and beliefs. It s therefore satisfactory to learn that this year the census has been taken in record time, and with unusual completeness. The provisional returns give the population as 315,-000,000 an increase of upwards of 20,000,000 since the 1901 census. That they were furnished only ten days after the taking of the census is a striking tribute to the efficiency of its staff organization, and has elicited the commendation of the governor-general. The population of Bombay is placed at 972,992, and but for a local trade depression, which caused the temporary absence of many of the usual residents it would probably have reached the million mark.


