

### CYPHERS' OUTDOOR BROODERS.

In the Cyphers Outdoor Brooder Style A (with a total floor space of 30x60 inches), we not only have a double apartment arrangement, consisting of the hover and the well-lighted apartment surrounding same, but we have for daytime use what amounts to a separate, cooler brooder, or two brooders in one (see illustration). The front half of this brooder is reached by a runway, and the chicks during the day time have

curtain being provided, which retains most of the heat in the rear part of the brooder, thus giving them three different temperatures: one the warmest, under the circular hover; another, some eight to ten degrees cooler in the rear apartment, outside the hover, and another, still cooler by ten or twelve degrees, in the front apartment. At any time when the weather is stormy, or it is too cold for the chicks to be out on the ground, they can be fed and watered in this front apartment with both safety and convenience.

access to this part, which is also lighted by two panes of glass. In other words, both the back part, or brooding chamber, and the front part or feeding rooms are well lighted, and if the weather is extra severe day or night, the runway connecting with the front part may be closed, thus confining all the heat to the rear apartment, where the chicks are brooded under the circular hover, with its heavy, fringed curtain. During the day time this runway is let down, and the chicks may run back and forth at will, a heavy woollen
