THREATENED DISRUPTION OF THE COUNCIL.

At the close of the last meeting of the Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, the Homœopathsists signified their intention of withdrawing from the Council, giving as one of their reasons the fact that Dr. Campbell—who was Vice-President last year—was not appointed President this year, another reason being, that although the Council had been in operation four years, no students of their persuasion had presented themselves for examination. In regard to the latter objection, either of two things must have been the cause, viz., that there is no longer any demand for practitioners of their school of faith, or else their students are averse to the high standard of qualification required by the Council; for even Dr. Campbell will not say that, by any possible means, injustice could have been done them by the examiners at the Board. In reference to the former, we incline strongly to the belief that personal feeling was the chief obstacle in the way of Dr. Campbell's promotion to the presidency of the Council. We are not aware that the Homœopathsists have as yet officially sent in their resignation, and we think it quite probable they will not do so until they have brought their alleged grievances before the Legislature, and have received a favorably reply from that august body.
