On Tuesday Wednesday, and Thursday, no fewer than eight cases were reported -- seven unles and one female. Two of these cases were of young persons—one, a boy of five, emptied a bottle of whisky which had been left at hand, and was poisoned; the other, a boy, 14, was found dead by his companions; he had been drinking and lay down to sleep, but could not be awakened. This is a death-roll of twelve persons through drink.
