EET updates the database twice a year - in April and October - as the originating statistical agencies issue more recent and revised information.

Divisions requiring answers to dayto-day research questions similar to the information provided in the attached database should consult the library's research staff who are available to provide advice and direction on data sources for statistical projects. In addition to assisting you in this work through the creation of the attached database, however, EET can and will provide methodological advice to officers from other Divisions if sufficient lead time is given.
