

TRANSPORTATION

Local press transportation arrangements are being made, in the three cities to be visited, by the central and regional press committees. Buses will be provided from Charlottetown to Summerside, P.E.I. and return to Charlottetown for the arrival of the Royal Party. It is expected that press buses in Charlottetown, Quebec and Ottawa will be provided to transport press representatives from the press rooms in these cities to cover the various functions listed in the itinerary. The Press Transportation Officer supervising such operations for the entire tour is Captain R. M. Gervais, Royal Visit Press Office, Ottawa, Tel. 992-1002.

Since train and bus transportation between Charlottetown and Quebec will be scarce and time-consuming, it is hoped that chartered aircraft secured by the Royal Visit Public Relations Committee will be available. If a sufficient number of media representatives forward to the Royal Visit Press Office, 503 Daly Bldg., Ottawa cheques for \$40. made out to Air Canada, press flights will depart from Charlottetown for Quebec during the afternoon of Thursday, Oct. 8, permitting a period of approximately thirty-six hours in Quebec before the arrival of the Royal party aboard H.M.Y. *Britannia*.

For those who wish to attend the Press Reception aboard the *Britannia* in Quebec and also wish to cover the arrival of The Queen and Prince Philip at Uplands in Ottawa a few hours later, air transport will be a necessity, and chartered aircraft will be available if a sufficient number of press applications, accompanied by cheques for \$17.50 made out to Air Canada, are forwarded to the Royal Visit Press Offices, Ottawa as mentioned above. No seats can be guaranteed on either of these two legs of the tour if application is made after Monday, Sept. 28, although some seats may still be available after that date.

Buses for group airport arrivals and departures in the three cities visited will be provided, plus transportation of bag-
