Y2K Travel Checklist

Before you go:

- Take responsibility for your Y2K travel. Be prepared. Make an informed decision about whether to travel.
- Check your insurance policy carefully.
- Make sure you have adequate funds.
- Obtain the address of the Canadian embassy or consulate nearest to your destination.
- Develop alternative plans and leave them, along with contact numbers, with someone in Canada.

Once you're there:

- Know how to get in touch with the nearest Canadian government office.
- Inform yourself of conditions when you arrive.
- Develop a backup plan in case problems arise.
- In an emergency, call collect from abroad:
