Among two-parent, one-earner families, the proportion with low income in 1989 (18.2\%) was up from the 1980 rate (15.8\&) Statistics Canada says. Those families with two-earners had almost the same rate ( $5.2 \%$ versus $5.3 \%$ ).
"Two-parent, one-earner families had an average income of $\$ 42,171$ compared to $\$ 54,697$ for two-earner families," the agency said in a report on family incomes.

Average income across the country fnr all types of families was $\$ 50,083$ last year, 3.3 per cent higher than in 1988 on an inflation adjusted basis.

Since 1984 , when the upward trend began, real income had increased $11.5 \%$, Statistics Canada said.
