On motion of Sir *Charles Tupper* it was *Resolved*, That The House do approve of the contract for the construction of one hundred miles of that portion of the Canadian Pacific Railway, commencing at the end of the 48th Contract, near the Western Boundary of Manitoba, and extending to a point on the west side of the Valley of Bird Tail Creek, which Contract was laid on the Table of The House on the 3rd instant.

The Bill No. 126 for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money required for defraying certain expenses of the public service, for the financial years ending respectively the 30th June, 1880, and the 30th June, 1881 ; and for other purposes relating to the public service, was read the second, and a third time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. *Stephenson*, the fourth Report of the Select Committee appointed to supervise the Official Report of the Debates of this House during the present Session, was concurred in.

On motion of Sir *John A. Macdonald* it was *Resolved*, That when The House adjourns *this day*, it do stand adjourned until *to-morrow* (Friday) at 11 o'clock A.M.
