commic system which will emable him to use those resources fully. This, as I say, is a new thing in human history. It means, on the one hand, that if we can solve that problem (and correcting it is certainly soluble by man because it is exercise by human skill defects in the human organization) we can have a material basis for our civilization adequate, and more than adequate for all our needs. But if the premise is so great, the menace is also no less great. For it is equally true that if we fail to find the solution, we have the danger of falling back to incalculable chaos. We have, therefore, I suggest, as a stimulus for those studying accommics, and not only accommics but every other art and science related to government, - the double stimulus of the great menace if we fail in our task but of the illimitable probise if we succeed. (applause)
