of Agriculture at Ottawa may account for the increased interest in this field. Preparation involves graduate training. There is some enquiry for the opportunity for graduate training of students in economics who intend to specialize in the problems of agriculture. It is obvious that this work cannot be provided by a small department unless by some arrangement whereby the major portion of the work could be secured at McGill. The department at Macdonald College might get in touch with the students and provide the problems for investigation. In regard to possible investigational work on the problems of agriculture the lack of, need for and advantages from statistical investigation and analysis warrants special emphasis. The potentialities of McGill University and Macdonald College as a graduate school for workers in agriculture would indicate that this development might be given some consideration.
